

## FREE ANNIE & SNOWMAN ANGEL MAGNET PATTERN - NOT FOR RESALE -



### SUPPLIES:

*Muslin (scraps) • Homespun (scraps) • Warm & Natural (scraps) • Fiberfill • #4/0 & #3/0 black snaps  
DMC Embroidery Floss: Barn red (#221), Mocha Brown-Lt (#3782) • Black (#310) • Orange (#3853)  
Barn red acrylic paint • Unsweetened Instant tea • rusty tin wire • 1" rusty tin star • Magnets • Hot Glue*

### ABBREVIATIONS

**PP:** Pattern Piece

**RSO:** Right Side Out

**RST:** Right Sides Together

### ANNIE

Trace head onto doubled muslin using the **PP** provided. Sew all the way around and slit in back through one layer for turning. Turn **RSO**. Stuff then whipstitch opening closed. Cut out the template for the nose and pin it to the face where it looks centered. Trace around the nose template with a disappearing marker. Thread your needle with 6 strand barn red embroidery floss (**DMC #221**) and anchor the floss in back close to the turning slit. Bring needle out through the front of the face on the bottom left hand side of the nose and work a satin stitch back and forth on your marked lines until you get to the top, then anchor the floss again in the back. The eyes are **#3/0 snaps**, sew them on with on with black embroidery floss, tying and knotting the ends of the floss in the back close to previous stitching. The mouth and eyebrows are made with 1 strand of black embroidery floss. You do not need to take the needle to the back of the head after each stitch, keep all the stitching up front till the end, just below the surface. When finished with the mouth and brows, anchor the stitching in back. Blush the cheeks with barn red acrylic paint and a stencil brush, using a dry brush method. Powder blush may also be used.

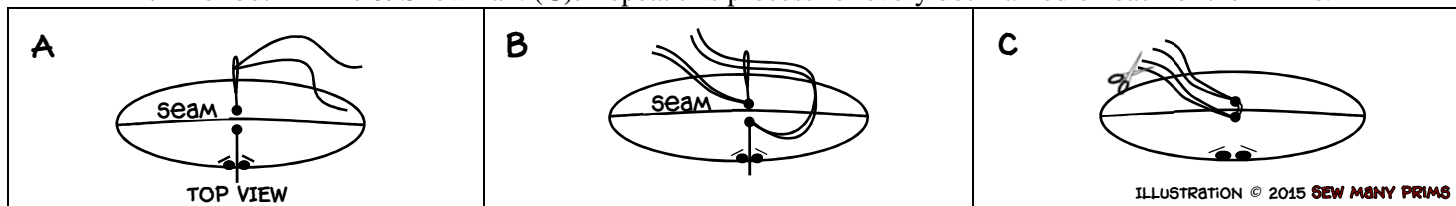
### SNOWMAN

Trace head onto doubled Warm & Natural using the **PP** provided. Sew around traced line, then slit in back through one layer for turning. Turn **RSO**. Stuff then whipstitch opening closed. Pin the snowman nose template to the face and trace around with a disappearing marker. Satin stitch a nose on the snowman with 6 strand orange embroidery floss (**DMC #3853**). The eyes on the snowman are **#4/0 snaps**; sew them on with black embroidery floss. The mouth and eyebrows are made with one strand of black embroidery floss. Blush cheeks if desired very lightly with a soft paintbrush with most of the paint wiped off. Powder blush may also be used.

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**Hair**

Thread your needle with 6 strand embroidery floss (DMC #221) for Annie & (DMC #3782) for the snowman. You'll want to center the needle on the thread so you will be working with doubled thread. Using their respective PP as a reference guide for hair placement, insert the needle in the back of the head seam & come out the front about 1/8" from the seam (A). Reinsert the needle into the first hole (in back) & come out the front hole again (B). Pull tight to secure. Trim to a length of 1/2" for both Annie & Snowman. (C). Repeat this process for every dot marked on each of their PP's.



**WINGS**

Trace around the PP for the wings onto doubled homespun, RST, with a layer of Warm & Natural underneath. Sew all the way around traced lines and cut a slit through one layer only for turning. Turn RSO and press with a low heat iron, too hot of an iron will make the batting shrivel.

**Tea Stain**

Make a mixture of about 1/2 cup Instant tea to 1 to 1 1/2 cups hot water, put in a spray bottle. Spray stain on the Annies, Snowmen and wings separately. Let dry in front of a fan.

**PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER**

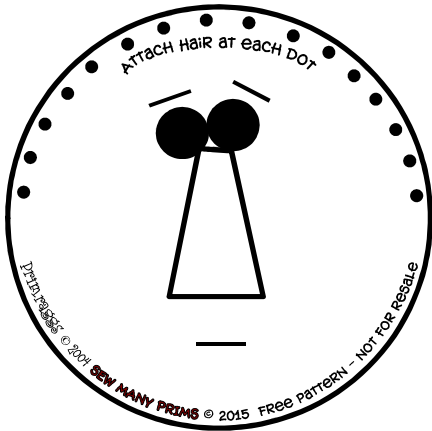
Halo is made with a 5" piece of rusty tin wire and a 1" rusty tin star with a hole in it. I poke holes in my stars with a hammer and large needle. Then, stick the wire through the star hole, 2 1/2" on each side and twist the wire very tightly, all the way down. Glue the halo to the wings, making sure it will stick up above head, then glue the head on too. A magnet will be glued to the back of the wings, approximately 1 1/2" long.

These make really cute Ornies too....just add that hanging string instead of a magnet.
